




Several groups in NC offer workshops that help youth and adults develop skills in many areas:

### The People's Assembly in Raleigh - HK on J

The NAACP of NC has built a large coalition called HK on J (Historic Thousands on Jones St.) in support of a People's Agenda with 14 issues.

Our state ranks 49th nationwide in education, the poverty rate is going up, and median household income is going down. Legislators have cut millions from education, Medicaid, mental health and other critical services –but they gave big tax breaks to wealthy corporations.

Add your voice to the thousands of North Carolinians who believe in economic and social justice. Join us at HK on J! Gather in Raleigh at 9:30 am, Feb. 9, at Shaw University (corner of Wilmington and South St.) and march to the Legislature, 16 W. Jones Street. The march begins at 10:30 am and lasts a couple hours, but the work of justice is year round. Be a part of this vital movement for change!

### Democracy for the People, Not Big Money!

In 2010, in a case called "Citizens United," the US Supreme Court ruled that corporations are the same as "people" and political spending is the same as "free speech." As a result, an unprecedented amount of corporate money is pouring into national and local elections, tilting democracy in favor of wealthy special interests

But people are fighting back! 13 cities in North Carolina have passed resolutions calling on Congress to overturn "Citizens United." Make your city number 14! Contact Democracy North Carolina at 919-286-6000 if you are interested in mobilizing your community against big money in politics.

## Voters choose politicians, politicians should not choose voters!

The same legislators in Raleigh who want to exclude voters who don't have a government photo ID also want to end Same-Day Registration, shorten Early Voting and pass other laws that make it harder for some people to vote. These politicians want to choose who votes - we have to call them out!

Same-Day Registration and Early Voting are popular reforms that have helped increase voter turnout in North Carolina and we know democracy works best when more people participate. Voting is a right that no politician should have the power to manipulate. Join Democracy NC, the NAACP and a coalition of others working to protect fair, sensible voting laws! Write a letter to the editor, hold a film showing about voting rights (see back for contact info), or take a group to visit your legislators in your hometown. Tell them to respect your vote!

### Say "yes" for fair elections

Look for the box below on your NC income tax form. When you mark "yes" it costs you nothing; your tax refund stays the same.

Marking YES shows support for the Public Campaign Fund. The Fund pays for producing a Voter Guide about statewide candidates for NC's courts and offers those candidates public campaign funds if they limit spending and refuse big donations.

The Fund helps a wider diversity of judges serve on our courts.
