

Nonprofit Voter Engagement Program – 2017

Background

Democracy North Carolina has committed to nonprofit voter outreach for years and has partnered with the national organization, Nonprofit VOTE for several elections. The research from this work shows that personal contacts by nonprofits have resulted in higher turnout rates among this constituency. For 2017, Democracy North Carolina is moving beyond voter registration and pledge activities to offer deeper civic engagement and education to nonprofit staff and clients.

Agencies in the 2017 program will receive:

- A civic engagement mini-grant (\$1,000 paid in installments) and voter engagement materials
- Training and support for staff to conduct voter engagement activities
- Educational and training opportunities related to civic engagement and voting rights designed for your staff and clients
- Democracy NC educational materials
- Assessment and evaluation of the voter engagement and educational efforts

Agencies are asked to:

- Agree to engagement of 250 people you serve at your agency and staff via voter registration, surveys, and trainings/education/focus groups. The minimum voter registration goal for participating agencies is 100.
- Designate a point person to coordinate the program and serve as contact for Democracy

- Submit copies of redacted voter registrations to Democracy NC
- Allow Democracy NC staff and advocates to engage your staff and agency's population
- Participate in calls periodically throughout the program with Democracy NC staff
